Eligibility Requirements:

- Eligible for LCSW, LCPC, or LMFT licensure in Idaho and Washington*

 *Dual licensure required for practice in Northern Idaho only; Idaho licensure is sufficient for practice in Boise
- Minimum 3 years' experience in an outpatient clinic setting
- Experience delivering trauma-informed care, including certification (highly preferred) in modalities such as EMDR or ART
- Proficiency in delivering Mental Health services via Telehealth applications
